Four (4) Oceania Scholarships for IASNR 2024 Conference

Are you an academic or practitioner in the social sciences from Oceania working on issues related to food and water security, climate change, and natural resource management in the region?

The University of Canberra's Centre for Environmental Governance (CEG) together with the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR) Social Systems program are offering **four (4)** scholarships for Oceania-based researchers and practitioners to:

- Attend the International Association for Society and Natural Resources (IASNR) conference in Cairns, Australia, from June 23-28, 2024.
- Reflect on your own relevant research insights and findings as part of question and answer sessions from the floor at organized panel events.
- Network with researchers and practitioners from across the region and worldwide.

The scholarship covers: Conference attendance fees, travel expenses including visa application fees, accommodation, and meals, up to a total maximum value of \$5,000 per person.

About IASNR: The <u>International Association for Society and Natural Resources</u> (IASNR) is the premier international academic association for natural resource management. IASNR is an interdisciplinary professional association that brings together social and natural scientists to research and develop strategies for addressing environmental and natural resource issues. How to Apply: Applicants must submit one-page letter addressing the following selection criteria the following to ceg@canberra.edu.au by Wednesday, May 15 2024:

- Short description of your work and its relevance to society and natural resources issues in Oceania.
- Description of your motivation for applying for the scholarship, including how attending the IASNR meeting and networking will benefit your work.
- An up-to-date summary of your curriculum vitae (CV) of no more than 2 pages.
