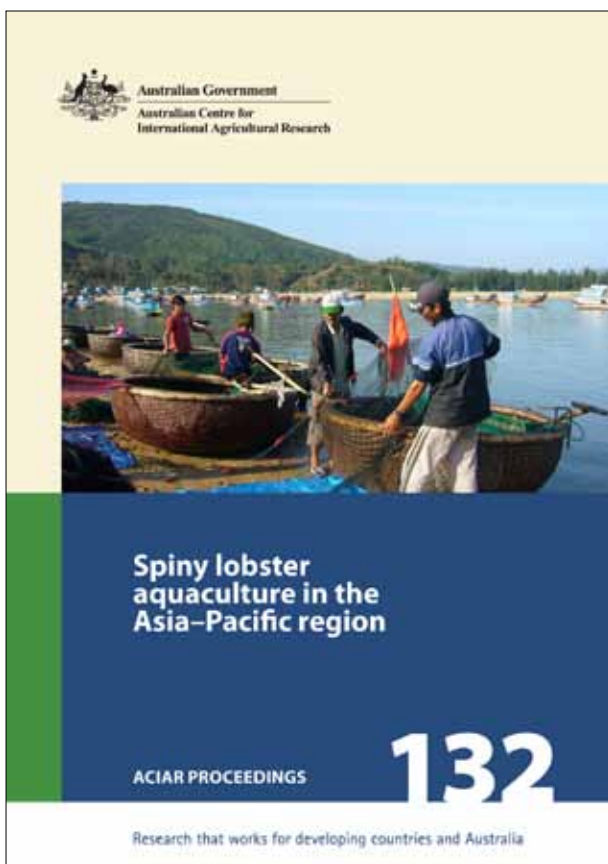

In addition to papers contributed by leading lobster researchers in the Asia–Pacific region, they include 16 papers that report the results of research carried out in a 4-year ACIAR lobster aquaculture project involving six agencies from Australia, Vietnam and Indonesia. The papers report work on:

- sustainable lobster aquaculture
- improving lobster nursery culture
- lobster grow-out culture systems
- lobster grow-out feeds and feeding practices.

These proceedings will be of interest to researchers, extension officers, aquafeed manufacturers and others who service the lobster aquaculture industry or who wish to better understand the issues that threaten the sustainability of lobster aquaculture in the Asia–Pacific region.
