security. Timor-Leste makes limited use of its living marine resources, in stark contrast to neighbouring nations and small island states globally. Promotion of sustainable marine resource use could significantly improve food security.

WorldFish partnered with communities, the National Directorate of Fisheries and Aquaculture (NDFA), local NGOs and international agencies, to develop and test strategies to improve livelihood resilience in coastal communities, increase food security, and provide for sustainable exploitation of near-shore marine resources. These strategies could help the Government of Timor-Leste 'rejuvenate the coastal fisheries sector', as articulated in the Timor-Leste Strategic Development Plan (2011 - 2030).
